## John A. (Jack) MacPhee Award

### **Description and Application**

John "Jack" MacPhee (February 25, 1914 - March 26, 1991) was one of the initial faculty members recruited when the Cortland Recreation Education Department was founded in 1947. Dr. MacPhee served the department in numerous capacities during his career. He was the department's original "Practicum Coordinator" and authorized the first <u>Guide to Recreation Field Work</u> in the United States. His senior Seminar Class organized and conducted the first Cortland Recreation Conference in 1950.

In addition to teaching duties, Jack coached several sports at SUNY Cortland including football and skiing. He personally remained an active athlete throughout his long association with the college (1946-1973).

This award is given to a deserving Recreation, Parks and Leisure Studies scholar/athlete who possesses those qualities for which John "Jack" MacPhee was well known.

The Award will be given to a Recreation, Parks and Leisure Studies major who:

- Has earned at least 90 credit hours towards graduation and will complete all degree requirements by May, August, or December 2014;
- Has maintained a minimum GPA of 3.0;
- Has displayed a high degree of intellectual competence and a level of athletic achievement unequaled by his or her peers; and
- Is recognized for his/her honesty, thoughtfulness, and willingness to help others whenever such a situation arises.
