## **SUNY Cortland Education Programs 3-Year Alumni Survey**

In 2016, the EPP created an Exit Survey which is parallel to the Alumni and Employer Surveys. The Exit Survey is administered to all student teachers at the end of their student teaching experience, just prior to graduation. As student teachers, participants are a "captive audience" so we are able to survey the entire population. This measure allows us to compare how completers perceive their preparation right at the end of their programs and then after one year. We also compare these perceptions to those gathered through the Alumni Survey. The Exit Survey first full year use was administered to completers graduating in fall 2016 and spring 2017, creating our May 2017 cohort. The May 2017 cohort was administered the 1-Year Exit Survey by Alumni in May 2018 (n=359) with a response rate of 18.5%.

Listed below is the 3-Year Alumni Survey to that given cohort and our first 3-Year Alumni survey since the creation of the EPP Exit Survey and Alumni Survey process. The 3-Year Alumni survey response rate of 20.5%.

Along with the Satisfaction Questions and Program Preparation Questions, Alumni are asked one additional question: Would you recommend your teacher education program to other prospective teachers? Findings show that 91% of the respondents would definitely or probably recommend their teacher education program.
