- 6. Update on NY State Ed Proposal to adjust current MA requirement for professional certification (New vocab terms: 'Multiple Pathways' & 'Stacked Micro-Credentials')
  - a. Has yet to go before the Board of Regents
    - i. timeline of being discussed by the Board of Regents may be December or January
    - ii. once approved, easier things to implement would be released first and then move to accomplish all. No definitive timeline.
  - b. Teaching Assistant pathways to bachelor's degree
  - c. Multiple pathways to professional teaching certification:
    - i. national board certification

- ii. 450 clock hours of post baccalaureate education (could be through BOCES, school district classes, or higher education institution through microcredentials) no specification in terms of how this would relate to their content area
  - 1. Example: Microcredential at SUNY Oneonta in Literacy for \$500. Sponsored by an outside organization.
  - 2. Concerns about faculty load and microcredentials, as no definitive definition
- iii. Master's degree
- d. No data to suggest that a master's degree is the reason why NYS is struggling with hiring teachers
  - i. 51% of teachers in the field whose states do not require a masters, get one anyway (in other states that often equates to an increase in pay)
  - ii. Master's degree allows for teaching AP classes and/or dual-enrollment courses
- e. Share at Faculty Senate meeting?
  - Waiting to receive copy of proposal and background information from NYSED
  - ii. Invite Andrea Lachance to present to Faculty Senate in the future and keep others informed of these possible changes (GFEC, Graduate Coordinators, other master's program stakeholders)
  - iii. Share information with your departments! Collect and share data that demonstrates positive outcomes for teachers with master's degrees.
