## Child Abuse Recognition & Reporting (CARR)

The workshop involves recognizing signs of child abuse and teaches individuals how to contact the appropriate authorities when abuse is suspected.

The New York State Office of Children and Family Services now offers FREE 24/7 online Mandated Reporter Training in Child Abuse and Neglect/Maltreatment Identification. This 2-hour web-based training is full narrated and interactive and features learning exercises customized for the Child Care, Social Services, Law Enforcement, Education and Medical Professions. ## Safe Schools Against Violence in Education (SAVE)

This workshop was developed as a response to the ever-increasing violence in our schools. This workshop will provide school personnel with awareness of violence prevention and intervention skills and techniques that they can use.

Project S.A.V.E. is a 2-hour web-based course that is required of professionals who work in the schools in New York State. The course takes approximately 2 hours to complete and does not need to be done in one session.
