One of the new requirements is the Teacher Performance Assessment (TPA). Authored and developed by a team of Stanford University researchers, with substantive advice from teachers and teacher educators, the TPA is designed to be used as a portfolio-based assessment for pre-service teacher candidates. Supported by an initiative involving more than 25 states and more than 180 participating institutions as well as the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education (AACTE), the TPA will be available nationally for states, institutions of higher education, and teacher candidates.
