

## Course Criteria for the Presentation Skills Requirement

### Purpose:

To provide students with skills and experience in making oral presentations: improve students' abilities to organize thoughts and present them orally; and teach students self-critique and peer-critique oral presentation skills.

### Course Eligibility:

1. Students will make at least one presentation in the course and respond to questions and comments following the presentation.
2. Student must submit at least one outline with attached source list related to the presentation.
3. Students must evaluate their own presentation and those of other students, according to criteria provided by the instructor
4. Faculty provide instruction in effective presentation skills specific disciplines including requirements and methods of preparation for oral assignments (i.e., structure, research, outlining, visual components, creativity and delivery).
