

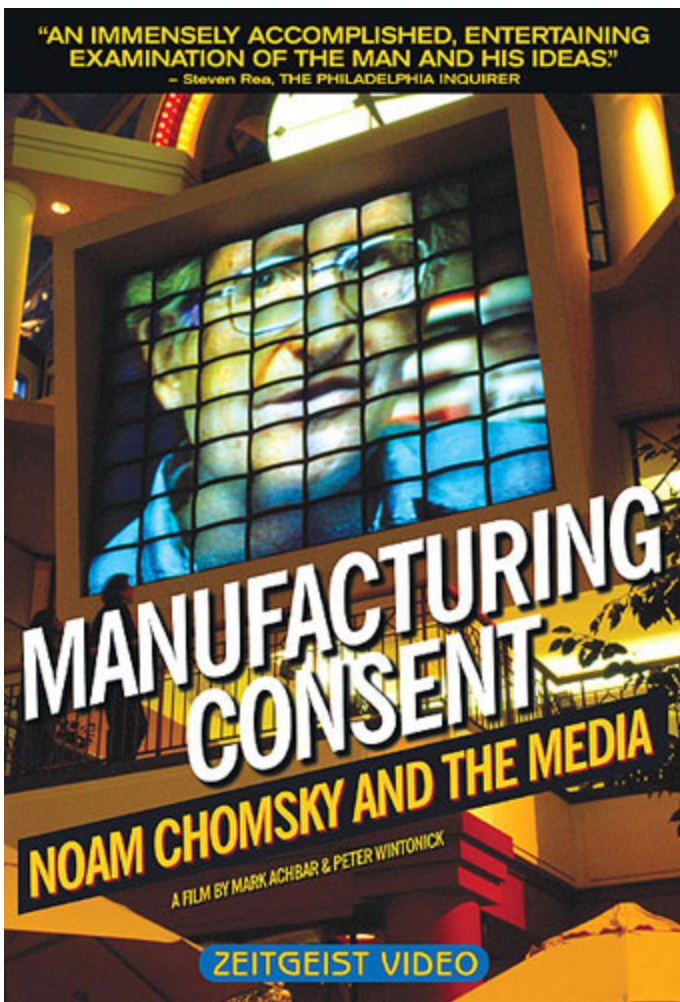

Untold Stories (Part I): Manufacturing Consent



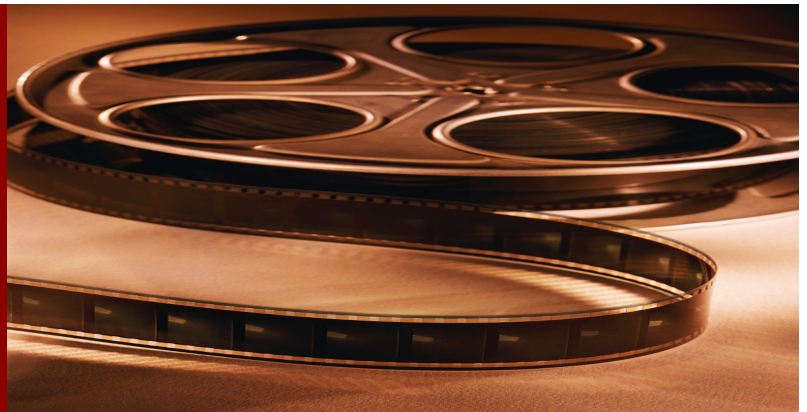

Untold Stories (Part II): Outfoxed



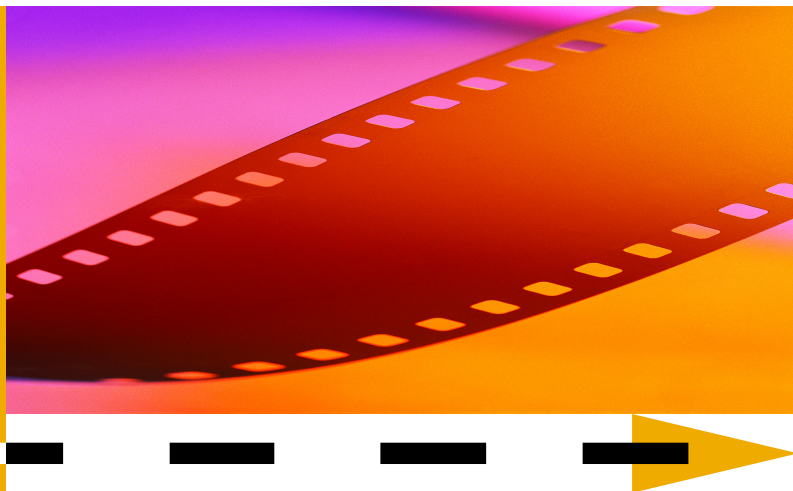
