<b>Faculty Development Center</b> <a href="http://www2.cortland.edu/offices/fdc">http://www2.cortland.edu/offices/fdc</a>				<i>The FDC builds community among the faculty by promoting an open and exploratory intellectual environment supportive of teaching and scholarship. Their mission includes enabling professional development through small grants programs that pilot innovative teaching methods and other initiatives related to faculty development; recognizing and promoting good teaching through annual awards programs; mentoring new faculty to support reappointment, tenure and promotion; and providing forums for conversation on issues related to teaching and scholarship.</i>
<b>Teaching Innovation Grant Program</b>	\$500	March 29 annually	Fall or spring semester of the subsequent year	<i>This program encourages the development and sharing of new instructional strategies among faculty.</i>
<b>Small Grants Program</b>	Maximum \$500	Sept 15 and Feb 15	July 1 to June 30	<i>This program supports the professional development of faculty and staff through activities like special educational opportunities for students; improving internal and/or external communication at the College; enhancing the image of the College; accommodating unique or unusual contingencies that fit nowhere else.</i>
<b>College Research Committee</b> <a href="http://www2.cortland.edu/offices/rspo">http://www2.cortland.edu/offices/rspo</a>				<i>The College Research Committee is a standing Committee of the Faculty Senate charged with promoting research on the SUNY Cortland campus. Members representing all areas of the College are appointed based on their experience in successfully obtaining research funding and serving as proposal reviewers for external agencies. The Committee reviews Faculty Research Program applications, proposals to funding sources that limit the number of proposals the College may submit, and nominees for the Outstanding Achievement in Research Awards and recommends awardees to the Provost and Vice President of Academic Affairs.</i>
<b>Faculty Research Program</b>	\$1,000 to \$3,000	Dean's Office by 1/27/2017 RSPO by 2/3/2017	July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018	<i>The FRP provides seed money for projects that are new and likely to lead to future funded research. Full time, tenured and tenure-track faculty and professional staff are eligible.</i>

<b>Undergraduate Summer Research Fellowship Program</b>	\$2,750 student and \$1,000 faculty	March 9, 2017	May 2017 – August 2017	The URC offers a limited number of summer research fellowships requiring at least 8 weeks of full-time research or creative activities under faculty supervision. Free housing is available to Fellows through a partnership with Residence Life.
<b>The Small Grants Program</b>	Up to \$400	Throughout semester, no later than April 7, 2017	Fall and Spring semesters	This program supports original research or creative projects that students complete independently or in collaboration with other undergraduate students. The award is designed to help defray the cost of travel, supplies, and other materials deemed necessary to successfully conduct the project.
<b>Undergraduate Research Assistant Program</b>	Work-study research assistant to work with faculty	April 21, 2017	Entire academic year (student works 10 hrs. weekly)	Faculty program to provide a work study student to assist and support faculty with their research/scholarly activities. Several faculty within a department or across disciplines can jointly apply for a single student research assistant position.
<b>Student Research Travel Grants</b>	Typically less than \$500	Nov 4, 2016  March 24, 2017	for travel between July 1-Dec 31, 2016  for travel between Jan 1 and June 30, 2017	This program is designed to assist with reimbursing travel costs of SUNY Cortland full-time undergraduate students who travel to present the results of their research at regional, national, or international conferences. Students must have a faculty sponsor/mentor.
<b>Graduate Faculty Executive Committee</b> <a href="http://www2.cortland.edu/academics/curriculum/committees/GFEC.dot">http://www2.cortland.edu/academics/curriculum/committees/GFEC.dot</a>	The GFEC provides administrative leadership for SUNY Cortland's graduate faculty subject to ongoing review and approval by the Faculty Senate. The GFEC is charged with accepting responsibility for graduate curricula and associated graduate academic affairs of the College. The graduate faculty provide an advisory mission to the administrative officers designated for graduate studies and related affairs. Included in its activities, the committee reviews graduate student funding opportunities to promote research and creative activities and travel to present at conferences of SUNY Cortland graduate students.			
<b>Graduate Small Grants Program</b>	Varies	No later than April 10, 2017	July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017	This program supports original research or creative activities that students complete independently or in collaboration with other graduate students. The award is designed to help defray the cost of travel in direct support of the project being conducted, equipment and supplies not budgeted by the sponsoring department, and other materials deemed necessary to successfully conduct a project.
<b>Graduate Research Travel Grants Program</b>	Typically less than \$500	November 14, 2016  April 10, 2017	for travel between July 1-Dec 31, 2016  for travel between Jan 1 - June 30, 2017	This program assists with reimbursing travel costs of SUNY Cortland graduate students who travel to present the results of their original research at regional, national, or international conferences.
