<u>I. Approval of Minutes:</u> The Minutes from September 22nd were approved by the Senate.

II. Chair's Report: G. Birren – Reported that when the steering committee met last week, they decided it would be appropriate to create a presidential award for excellence in diversity and inclusion; there needs to be a draft of the award, and G. Birren asked that if there are any senators that might be interested in working on the draft for the award that they should contact her.

V. President's Report: E. Bitterbaum:

- Due to the governor's and NYS Health Department's mandate that any campus reaching 100 or more positive COVID-19 cases will have to shift to remote learning, SUNY Cortland will be teaching remotely for at least the next 2 weeks; after that period of 2 weeks, it will then be up to each individual faculty member whether to return to face-to-face instruction or remain teaching remotely.
 - Students will be expected to remain in place for the next 2 weeks of remote instruction, unless there is an emergency reason as to why they must leave, in which case documentation will be required from the student.
 - If a student does have to return home for an emergency situation, before that student can return to campus, he or she will be required to obtain a negative COVID-19 test

- Updates to Mediation and Resolution Service A proposed service to provide academic and professional faculty members with an informal, confidential, impartial, and independent resource to address concerns or questions openly without fear of retaliation or judgment (*Please find MRS Bylaws document attached*).
 - A. Fitz-Gibbon informed the senate that this service was a charge from the UFS to be initiated as a 2 year pilot program at SUNY Empire State, as well as here at SUNY Cortland.
 - The MRS Committee (which is <u>not</u> a senate committee) will have its initial meeting soon with the provost, J. Pittsley (UUP), A. Fitz-Gibbon (Chair), along with the other faculty representatives of the committee.

X. New Business:
