If someone tells you they have experienced sexual violence

What to do

- Offer support. Listen and encourage them to seek help and counseling as soon as possible.
- If immediate safety is a concern, call 911.
- Cut this card along the dotted line. Keep this half and give them the other half.
- Report the incident to the Title IX Coordinator per the policy listed on the back of this card.

If you have experienced sexual violence

What to do

- Get safe.
- Get medical help.
- Get emotional help and support.

What to know

- It was not your fault.
- You are in control.
- Many resources are available to you on campus and in the community. (see reverse side)
- You have the right to choose whom and what to tell, and when.
- If you report, you'll be taken seriously and treated with dignity and respect.

- SUNY Cortland
 - Does not tolerate sexual harassment, sexual assault, relationship violence or stalking.
 - Does not tolerate retaliation against anyone reporting sexual violence or participating in an investigation or conduct process.
 - Has an amnesty policy for alcohol/drug use in sexual violence cases.

- Submit an anonymous report.
- Report to law enforcement:
 - University Police Department
 - Cortland Police Department
 - NYS Police Hotline
- Report to Title IX to start a College process.

Who needs to report to Title IX?

All employees are asked to report to Title IX. If a student reports an incident to a faculty or staff member they believe has the authority or duty to address it, they are considered by the Office for Civil Rights to be a “responsible employee.” They must promptly - within 24 hours - report the incident to the Title IX Coordinator on campus.

Exceptions to this reporting requirement are made for employees who operate under professional confidentiality. On our campus that includes the Counseling Center staff and Student Health Service staff.

When in doubt on whether or not to report, contact your supervisor or the Title IX Coordinator at 607-753-4550.

Why you need to report

- To ensure the individual has access to all available resources and options.
- For campus and community safety.
- To comply with Title IX and other federal regulations.

What to tell the individual

Their disclosures will be taken seriously, and they'll be treated with dignity and respect. Victim/survivor privacy is carefully maintained, and they have the right to receive assistance from the College as well as the right to make a report to law enforcement.

Prohibition on retaliation

SUNY Cortland will not tolerate retaliation against anyone for filing a complaint or participating in an investigation.
