
Dear COR 101 Student.

Please complete the CSI™ online **before Wednesday, September 27 at Midnight**. You should also <u>print (or save)</u> a copy of your results immediately after you take the inventory.

- 1) To access the CSI™, type the following URL into your browser:
 - https://studentsurvey.noellevitz.com/SUNYCortland/COR101-2017CSI
- 2) Click "Open Survey" to open into a new browser.
- 3) At the Welcome screen, click on "TAKE SURVEY". You will be asked to input your student information. Then click "BEGIN SURVEY".



If you encounter technical problems while completing the survey, try logging back in and retake the survey again. You should be brought back to where you left off. Contact your COR Instructor or TA if you are unable to complete the survey after two attempts. Sometimes you may need to use a different computer or browser.

- 4) Complete, then print (or save) inventory immediately after taking but definitely before Wednesday, September 27 (or the deadline given by your instructor). You may have to move your mouse to the bottom of the screen to see the print/save options.
- 5) The last question on the inventory asks you to authorize Cortland to share results. We hope you answer "Yes" in order to serve you better. Thanks!
- 6) When reviewing your report, please use the information on the back of this page to help assess your results. You are encouraged to call or stop by the office(s) for assistance. Do not forget to look at the <u>positive information</u> offered in the report as there is no right or wrong answers.
