# SUNY Cortland Cupboard

#### What are the hours?

#### Who can use the Cupboard

Any current undergraduate or graduate SUNY Cortland student is welcome.

#### What about privacy?

All Cupboard staff have been trained in confidentiality. Your identity or food status will never be revealed to anyone.

#### Where is the Cupboard?

It is in the lower level of the Interfaith Center.

#### How many times can I use the Cupboard?

There is no limit on the number of visits. Come as many times as you need.



## I don't need food, but I know someone who does.

Encourage them to go. If they cannot come during the open hours, consider making a visit for them.

#### How much can I take?

You can take as many supplies as you need. We provide bags for ease of carrying.

#### What can I get?

The Cupboard has non-perishable food items (pasta, beans, rice, snacks...) as well as household items (toothbrushes, can openers, shampoos and soaps, etc.).
