It is in the lower level of
the Interfaith Center.

**How many times can I
use the Cupboard?**

There is no limit on the
number of visits. Come as
many times as you need.

come during the open hours, consider
making a visit for them.

How much can I take?

You can take as many supplies as you
need. We provide bags for ease of
carrying.

What can I get?

The Cupboard has non-perishable
food items (pasta, beans, rice,

(toothbrushes, can openers,
shampoos and soaps, etc.).
