Unrecognized Greek Organizations

- Are groups of students illegally using Greek letters calling themselves members of a National group when they are not and thus misleading students to "join" under false pretenses and with no College oversight; These groups are not actual fraternities.
- Unrecognized organizations at Cortland are the groups calling themselves Delta Chi, Omega Delta Phi (Omega or ODPhi), Pi Kappa Phi (Pi Kapp) and Tau Kappa Epsilon (Teke or TKE); They are illegally using these names and Greek letters.

Banned Greek Organizations

• Two local fraternities have been permanently banned by the College for repeated actions that endangered the physical and psychological wellbeing of our students; These banned groups are Beta Phi Epsilon (Beta) and Delta Kappa Beta (Kappa).

The College's Code of Student Conduct states: Students found to pledge, be a member of, or live in any residence of a permanently banned group will likely face a lengthy suspension or permanent dismissal from the College.

Reasons Students Join a Greek Organization

- Belief in the values of the organization
- Leadership, community service, networking and social opportunities
- Place to belong and be accepted for who you are

Community Service

- Greeks completed 4,123 community service hours in 2016-2017
- Assistance was provided to Cortland Youth Bureau, Lime Hollow Nature Center, local Soup Kitchen, YMCA and YWCA, etc.

Philanthropy

- Greek Life raised approximately \$36,500 in 2016-2017
- Funds raised benefited the philanthropies officially endorsed by each organization as well as Cortland Youth Bureau, Crop Hunger Walk, Relay for Life and the YWCA of Cortland.

Academic Success

- All organizations value scholarship and recognize that members are here first and foremost to be students
- While grades can fluctuate, it is not true that joining a fraternity or sorority means your grades will falter, often times exactly the opposite is true
- At the end of 2016-2017, 47 of 657 Greek members had GPAs in the Summa Cum Laude range, 80 were in the Magna Cum Laude range, and 140 fell in the Cum Laude range

Expansion

- Panhellenic expansion is currently closed on this campus •
- Any student or group of students interested in bringing a new National organization to campus must discuss this option with the College's Associate Director of Campus Activities and Greek Affairs. This process takes time and work and there are no guarantees that the expansion will be approved.

 - 9 Unofficial copies of transcripts are acceptable as long as they show student name, school name, cumulative GPA and number of credit hours completed
- Eligibility verifications are conducted through the College's Campus Activities Office






