Proposed Policy for Use of Smart Classrooms

SMART technology classrooms will be available to the faculty at-large. Priority in scheduling these classrooms will be given to faculty who use the electronic features* of the SMART technology classrooms.

Non-electronic equipment will not be delivered to the SMART technology classrooms to substitute for the electronic equipment already in place (manual screens for motorized screens; overhead projectors for visualizers, etc.).

*Electronic features not available in other classrooms include computer, data projector, visualizer, and centralized electronic control of all equipment.
