2019 Kente Celebration

Multicultural Life and Diversity hosted their Annual Kente Celebration on Saturday, April 6, 2019. The Kente Celebration symbolizes and commemorates the rite of passage for learners and scholars who are transitioning from institutions of higher learning to the next chapter of their lives. The Kente Celebration has deep institutional history and is an important experience for our multicultural student

This year's Kente Celebration is the biggest in the history of SUNY Cortland. 106 graduating seniors and graduate students participated this year. Distinguished Kente Honorary Stoles were presented to the following faculty and staff members: James Felton, Brandon Manning, Sebastian Purcell, Nanette Pasquarello and Ibipo Johnston-Anumonwo.

The keynote speaker was Yusuf Muhammad, Jr. '99, M '01, a principal at George Washington Carver High School in Atlanta, GA.

During the ceremony, Valarie Moise was presented with the inaugural Calvin Louis-Juste Memorial Award, honoring a student who reflects the leadership qualities of the late Louis-Juste, a 2009 Haitian-American graduate who died in 2011.
