- Sent low enrolled courses to Bruce, some seats are under enrolled but we need seats for first year students
- Closing a low enrolled class can open another course section

• Enrollment for Fall: applications are up but we may be a little bit behind – not sure but nothing catastrophic

Open Discussion

- For outside speakers that cost \$600 or less the funds need to come from research foundation
 - o Payment for meals is limited to 2 members
 - Should we pay more so we can use state funds?
 - o Bruce is concerned because some departments have limited foundation funds
 - o What if the funding comes from several departments?
 - To get CALS funds requires multiple departments
 - We need to find an efficient solution
- Legacy CTEs will be ending this summer
 - We are looking at options for a new system
 - o Will he have access to previous CTEs? -- Bruce, will check
