Before joining Cortland, Lorraine served as the CDO for three SUNY community colleges, executive director of the Human Rights Commission of Sullivan County, and senior project associate at the Technical Assistance Center on Disproportionality at NYU where she worked with over 60 New York State schools cited for disproportionality of minorities in special education and/or suspension and supported school districts in the development of culturally responsive policies and practices.

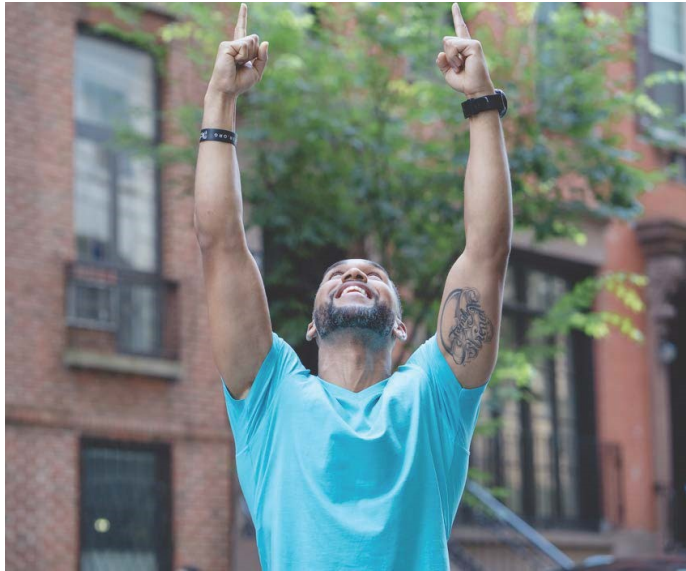
