TWO CERTIFICATIONS

Undergraduates are prepared to earn dual New York state certification in childhood education and special education for grades 1 through 6. Courses include topics such as inclusive education; multicultural and urban education; the role of race, class, gender and disability in schooling; and the relationship between schools and society.
