Other high-achieving students can apply to join during their studies at SUNY Cortland.
Participants must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.2.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The SUNY Cortland Honors Program welcomes students who are intellectually curious, seek an academic challenge and may want to further their education after undergraduate study.

CAPSTONE EXPERIENCE

Honors students work toward completing a senior thesis or capstone project, receiving input from a faculty advisor. The program guides students through each step, including the selection of a topic. The end result is an impressive expression of independent scholarship or creative activity.

ADDITIONAL EXPECTATIONS

Students traditionally take one or two honors courses per semester. They should aim to complete 12 to 15 honors credit hours by the end of sophomore year. Other activities such as study abroad offer honors credit.

Program members can live together in a first-year residence hall. They also may live with a roommate of their choosing.
