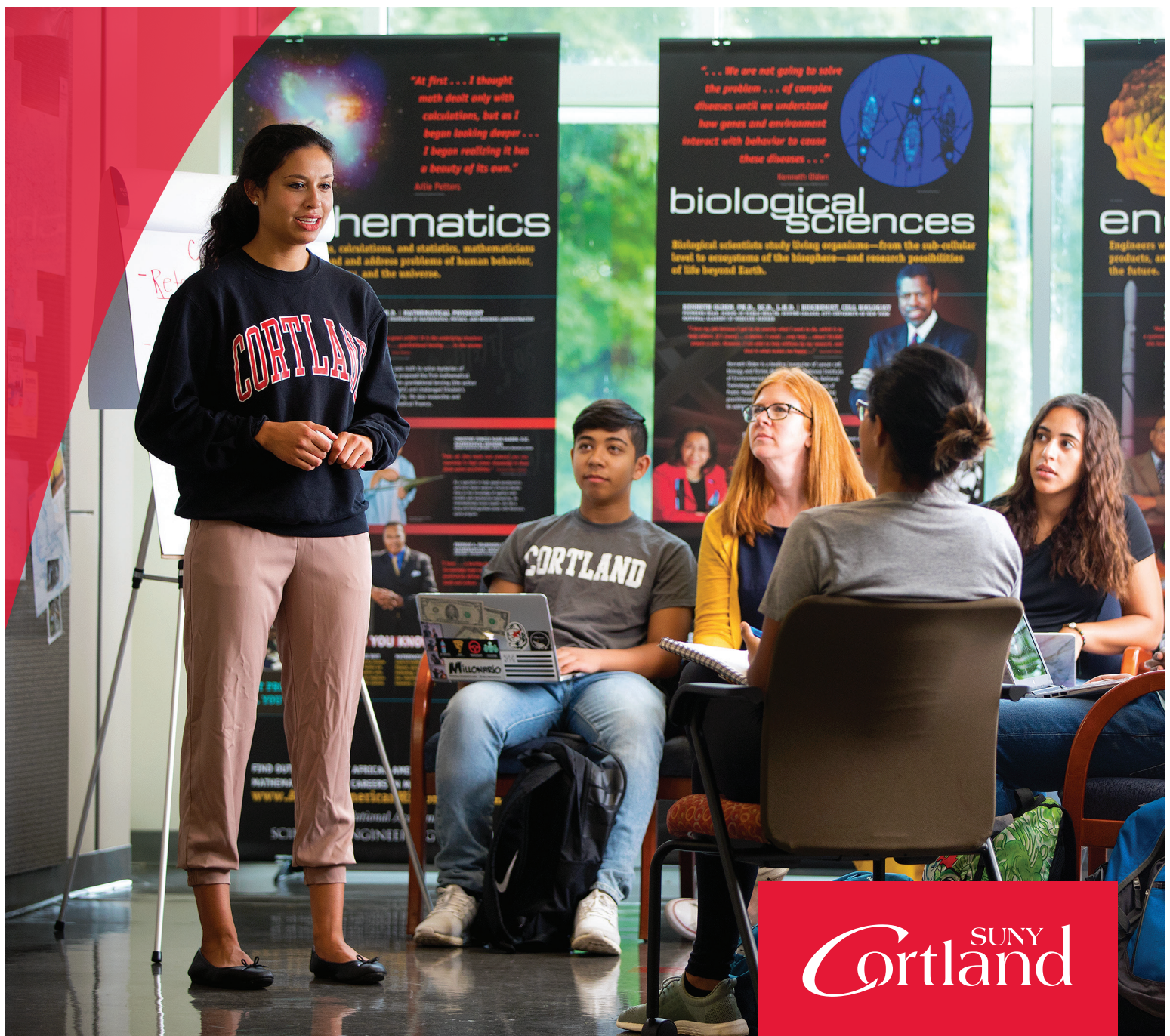

QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants must be interested in teaching in an urban area and willing to commit to at least two years of doing so. Priority is given to students who are from groups that are underrepresented in teaching. This includes applicants who are African American or black, Latinx, Native American or from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

→ C.U.R.E. participants can represent any major that leads to teacher certification.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Cortland's Urban Recruitment of Educators (C.U.R.E.) is a program that aims to address the need for highly qualified urban teachers by offering a \$4,000 annual scholarship to students who commit to two years of teaching in an urban area upon graduation. Since 1998, C.U.R.E. has increased the diversity of the teaching profession and supported high-quality urban teaching by placing more than 175 graduates in schools.

PROGRAM BENEFITS

In addition to the scholarship incentive, C.U.R.E. students receive specialized academic and leadership mentoring for their own college success. Special preparation for urban school placements begins in their first year on campus.
