SUNY Cortland's Title IV code for the FAFSA is **002843**. Students must list this code when completing the application to receive a financial aid offer letter from the university.

THE FEDERAL AID PROCESS

Students who list SUNY Cortland on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will receive a financial aid offer after their acceptance. This package may include a combination of federal and state grants as well as institutional aid, loans or Federal Work-Study plus estimated family contribution. Students applying for the fall semester should file by Feb. 1.

IN-DEPTH INFORMATION

A general overview of financial aid sources is provided online and in acceptance packages, while more detailed instructions are included in financial aid offers. Students enrolling in the fall begin to receive these offers in February.
