FIRST-YEAR ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

High school coursework

- 4 years of English and Social Studies
- 3-4 years of Math, Science and Foreign Language

GPA and test scores (middle 50%)

- GPA: 86 92 (unweighted)
- SAT: 1100 1230
- ACT: 24 − 26

Additional considerations include patterns in academic performance, rigor of coursework and extracurricular involvement

TRANSFER ADMISSIONS

Application review

- 2.5 minimum GPA
- 3.2 average GPA

Consideration for credits earned, patterns in performance and intended major

TRANSFERRING CREDITS

credit source	score required
Advanced Placement (AP exam)	3 or better
College Level Examination Program (CLEP)	50 or higher
International Baccalaureate (IB)	4 or better
college coursework	C- or higher

Maximum credit limit accepted is 90 credit hours and 64 from two-year institutions.

MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS

- Presidential Scholarship: \$4,700 per year
 95 unweighted GPA and 29 ACT or 1300 SAT
- Merit Scholarship: \$3,000 per year
 93 unweighted GPA and 27 ACT or 1240 SAT
- Dean's Scholarship: \$2,000 per year
 93 unweighted GPA and 24 ACT or 1130 SAT
- Honors Scholarship: \$2,000 per year
 - * Minimum requirements for review
