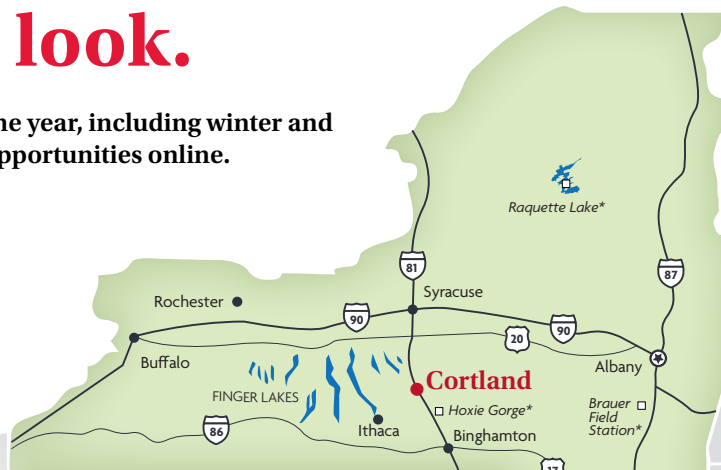

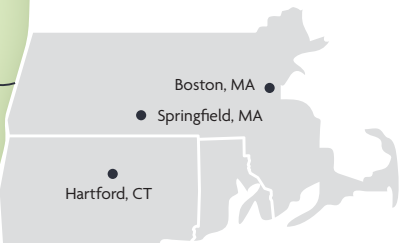

## INTRAMURALS

## OUTDOOR PURSUITS

→ Students of all ability levels are encouraged to explore the outdoors and pursue adventure through this area located in the Student Life Center. Regular opportunities often include:

**CLIMBING WALL:** Basic and advanced clinics, as well as competitions, are offered at our 42-foot climbing wall. First-time climbers can be trained in just 15 minutes.

**TRIPPING PROGRAM:** More than 100 individual trips have taken place on many weekends, spanning a few hours or several days. Activities include hiking, paddleboarding, bike riding, cross-country skiing, snow tubing and skydiving.

**OUTDOOR GEAR RENTAL CENTER:** More than 1,000 items are available to rent for a fee, including kayaks and canoes, camping equipment and cross-country skis.

**CORTLAND BIKE PROJECT:** More than 50 bicycles are available for students to check out for one week free of charge or to rent for the semester. Mountain bikes also can be rented for trail use.





# APPLICATION INFORMATION

## STUDENT PROFILE

- **Grade Average:** 88-94\*

\*Above range reflects middle 50% of first-year class.  
SUNY Cortland is test optional for applicants.

## COURSEWORK

First-year students should complete the following in each subject at New York State Regents level or higher:

- **English and Social Studies:** 4 units
- **Foreign Language, Mathematics and Science:** 3-4 units\*

\*If fewer than three units are taken in a subject, students must make up for it in another area.

## SCHOLARSHIP CONSIDERATION

- **Grade average:** Minimum 93 unweighted
- **Rigor:** Advanced or college-level courses
- **Main subjects:** Performance in major coursework areas

**NOTE:** Merit scholarships are awarded at the time of admission. There is no separate application.

## TRANSFERRING CREDITS

The following criteria must be met:

- 3 or better on AP exams
- 50 or higher on CLEP exams
- 4 or better on IB exams
- C- or higher in college coursework

## RECOMMENDED APPLICATION DATES

**First-year students:** Applications are reviewed in order of submission date.

- **Nov. 15** for early action option

**Transfer students:** Admissions are rolling until filled.

- **Nov. 1** for spring (deposit due 30 days after acceptance)
- **March 1** for fall (deposit due May 1 or 30 days after acceptance if accepted after April 1)

## PROGRAMS AND OPPORTUNITIES

### CORTLAND'S URBAN RECRUITMENT OF EDUCATORS (C.U.R.E.)

Grants a significant scholarship to dedicated teacher candidates who commit to two years of teaching in an urban area after graduation.

### EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM (EOP)

Provides financial support and academic help for students with strong potential who demonstrate academic underpreparation and economic disadvantage.

### HONORS PROGRAM

Offers scholarships and other benefits for high-achieving students who are intellectually curious. Members must complete a capstone project and course requirements.

### ARMY AND AIR FORCE ROTC

Prepares young adults to become officers in the U.S. military. In exchange for a paid college education and a guaranteed post-college career, cadets commit to serve in the military after graduation.
