#### Senior Application Tips: Admissions Follow-Up

- Use a general email that you will have access to after high school.
- Review the application instructions for communication preferences with your chosen institutions.
- Confirm that your common application is complete, including supplemental information, before reaching out.
- Contact the admissions department if you have new information like a major change or award to add to your application materials.
- Post your questions and show your excitement on the admissions social platforms. Colleges do monitor "demonstrated interest."
- Remember that admissions staff are reviewing a lot of applications, so be courteous and succinct in your communication.
