STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

SAMIRAH ROSARIO - SEMESTER IN COSTA RICA

Samirah Rosario, Junior Exercise Science major here at SUNY Cortland escaped upstate New York and spent her Fall Semester 2024 in San Jose, Costa Rica at Universidad Veritas. Here's some of the main highlights and common questions regarding her time abroad.





During Samirah's time there, there were Cortland-led excursions along with free time for students to explore and travel. One of her first trips was to Puerto Viejo, a southeastern beachside town located on the on the Caribbean coast of Costa Rica. "This part of Costa Rica has one of the biggest Afro Latin populations and it was amazing. The food was spectacular, the beach was beautiful, the night life was so unique, and it was my favorite trip."

Coursework Overseas

Students can choose to take courses in English or in Spanish at Universidad Veritas. Students can fulfill different requirements abroad for their degrees depending upon the classes, varying between General Education requirements or major-specific courses. Campus was accessible and had transportation from campus to the city of San Jose. "...I decided to focus more on getting all my General Education requirements done while in Costa Rica. In the end I was taking four classes each, totaling to 15 credits for the semester. I took two classes a day, leaving my Fridays off."

Housing Accommodations & Student Life

Housing styles can differ between programs. For Samirah, she got matched with a host family after completing a short questionnaire. Along with her were three other international students residing with the same family for the semester. Outside of class, Universidad Veritas offered plenty of extracurriculars for all students to partake in.

NEW PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT: SUMMER SESSION IN DOMINICA

A new program being introduced to SUNY Cortland's International Programs catalog is a 10 day, three credit faculty-led trip in Dominica, which is located in the Caribbean Sea. Dr. Jeremy Jimenez, faculty leader of this study tour and well-versed traveler, shared some details about the trip, including the program layout, student benefits, and what keeps him wanting to encourage students to study abroad.

The layout of the trip revolves around engaging with the local community and understanding the resilience they share to rebuild after natural disasters and how to manage with over-tourism. The course focuses on a multitude of aspects, including sociology, history, economics, geography, and other social science disciplines. "By day, we're engaging with local communities in schools/farms and/or some of Dominica's gorgeous landscapes (beaches, rainforests, waterfalls, lakes, etc.,), and in the evenings we'll have discussions about the day's experiences, which will sometimes include guest speakers from the community. "

While this program caters to all majors here at SUNY Cortland, it's a special opportunity for Education majors who would like to spend time teaching and learning with young students from such a culturally rich and diverse location.

Dr. Jimenez's main objective? To inspire others to travel and culturally immerse themselves as well. He touched on what drives his desire to help other students spend time abroad, stating:

"When I was 19, I spent a summer teaching abroad in Costa Rica, and it was such a profoundly transformative experience for me that I went on to not only get my Ph.D. in International and Comparative Education, but go on to visit over 180 countries around the world. I hope to similarly inculcate our students with a love of engaging deeply with the beautifully diverse cultures and landscapes of our life-supporting planet."

This study abroad program earns three credits as FSA 369, which is Dominica: Development and Resilience. This course can fulfill many Major/Concentration-specific requirements and is only a 5-hour flight from New York. This program is also one of the most affordable study abroad programs that SUNY Cortland has to offer and is great for those looking for a short-term program. Included in the 10-day trip are required readings and daily journal recordings.

Ruth Bannies: From Potsdam to Cortland



The University of Potsdam has three different campus locations, each with student residencies, and is a very short ride (roughly 40 minutes by public transit) to Berlin. Each of the three campuses have a library, and campuses are split depending on your major. Students can live on campus in dorms. Ruth stated that she misses the sports courses offered in Germany, along with some of the campus facilities. "The library is really a nice place."

Some things that Ruth loved about SUNY Cortland were making new friends, seeing sporting activities around campus, and being a part of the campus community. What differs between New York and Germany are the modes of transportation. Here, people are very reliant on cars, while back home, public transit, such as trams and trains are frequently taken.

Ruth's favorite memory here? A Leadership Excursion to Raquette Lake in mid-September, filled with gorgeous landscapes, opportunities to meet new people, and wilderness activities in the Adirondacks.
