What is your major and year?


I'm a senior dual major psychology and criminology with a minor in forensics.

What did you learn from studying abroad?

FULDA UNIVERSITY OF APPLIED SCIENCES WITH DR. MECKE NAGEL

We are pleased to highlight a unique semester, summer, and winter programs through Fulda University in Fulda, Germany. The program was launched by Dr. Mecke Nagel of the Philosophy Department. Dr. Nagel is from Fulda and helped establish the connection between Fulda University and SUNY Cortland. Dr. Nagel had the opportunity to teach courses at Fulda University in 2008, and she also developed an exchange program in 2011. SUNY Cortland is now a strategic partner with Fulda University, which allows exchange opportunities not just for students, but for faculty and staff as well.

The program is most popular in its summer and winter terms. Students can take German language courses and go on multiple excursions, including visits to local sites and museums and a trip to Berlin. Fulda is also known for having a large population of international students, giving anyone who studies abroad there an option not only to interact with German culture but with multiple other cultures throughout their experience. During the semester, students can take courses in social work, business, computer science, health, social sciences, and German.

Dr. Nagel encourages students to study abroad and in particular emphasizes studying abroad in a non-English speaking country. She believes this helps students improve their social-emotional learning and helps foster a sense of humility.





HOLI CELEBRATION

On April 10, the International Programs Office in conjunction with the History Department and the students in REC 415 course organized a Holi Celebration. Holi is a Hindu color festival celebrating love and the coming of spring. It is traditionally celebrated with holika, a bonfire where people toss sticks of wood labeled with what they want to leave behind in the new year, and by throwing colored dye at each other.


