

International Student Orientation

SUNY Cortland welcomed 34 new international students to campus on Aug. 24. They, along with our returning international students, represent 21 countries. They participated in a five-day orientation program designed specifically to help acclimate them to the United States and the Cortland area. Students listened to presentations from various offices, such as Residence Life and Housing, The Learning Center, the Library, and Student Conduct to learn about the services and resources available to them. They also participated in an Academic Honesty and Classroom Etiquette information session with Distinguished Professor Sharon Steadman and Professor Girish Bhat.

In addition to sessions during the day, the new international students participated in activities each evening introducing them to the Cortland area, including bowling and mini-golfing. The week was capped off with a picnic and hike at Taughannock Falls State Park on Saturday.

Thank you to everyone who made our International Student Orientation such a success! And a special thank you to our two Orientation co-coordinators and four Orientation assistants, who were with our new students every step of the way!

Welcome Party

The International Programs Office hosted an International Welcome Celebration on Friday, Aug. 27 as part of the Welcome Week festivities. The event welcomed international students to the SUNY Cortland campus and introduced American students to the many international opportunities available to them through our office. Despite a few raindrops, it was an enjoyable afternoon of conversation and food. Attendees also participated in a map activity where they placed pins in their home countries and those they hope to visit one day. University in Cambridge, England in
