STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

Maria Keeney & Yamelli Hernandez

We are placing the Spotlight on two of our Study Abroad Students, Maria Keeney and Yamelli Hernandez. They are set to graduate in the Spring of 2023. Our study abroad returnees Maria and Yamelli took the opportunity to study in Salamanca, Spain, Spring of 2022. The experiences abroad made them "better people" and, in turn, gave them experiences" for their respective "invaluable Studying abroad was a life goal of theirs. And according to them, the experience has forever impacted their lives. Both students made long-term emotional bonds with their host families and met locals whom, to this day, Maria and Yamelli still text and Facetime with from time to time. Salamanca, Spain, has a great mixture of rural and city living. Maria stayed in a more urban environment, while Yamelli was in a more rural setting where "sheep would roam" her host family's backyard. For students interested in studying abroad, Yamelli and Maria would like to share, "Do it! Travel, put yourself out there. Be patient. The weather is colder than we thought it was going to be. But Pack light! And bring a good pair of walking shoes."







Maria Keeney

Maria Keeney studied abroad as an undergraduate Adolescent Spanish education major at the University of Salamanca, Spain, during the Spring of 2022. Maria shared her experience, giving us insight into what it was like studying abroad. Studying abroad helped Maria immerse herself in a Spanish-speaking country.





"This experience has helped me get better at Spanish;
I learned a lot about the Spanish language and the
various cultures found in Spain. I will definitely use
that experience for teaching in the future."

Maria emphasized the effect studying abroad has had
on her learning experience.

"There are so many things out there that people don't know; that language is a barrier many people don't realize. So being able to learn another language feels like it's a great way of opening yourself up to new things, which I thought to be great."





Growing up in an English-speaking home, Maria took on the challenge of facing those language barriers.

"Going in, I had very little confidence in my Spanish. Here in America, inside the classrooms, there are not a lot of conversations in Spanish. In America, there is a lot of academic teaching, and not many conversations are being held in the classroom.

When asked about how big of a difference the food was,
Maria grinned joyfully; she loved the idea of tapas (small and savory dishes). "Many
people would have tapas for dinner, which was great. Having a variety of dishes for
dinner was delicious, and I could taste various foods found in Salamanca." Maria
would go out with her host mom and try about 5 different places in one day. "To
students who want to study abroad, eat tapas! They are a great way to try different
foods. Everything was so delicious. I ate nothing that I didn't like."







"Being immersed in Spanish in Salamanca helped me so much just by always hearing it. It was nice and purposeful." Living and talking to her host mom also gave Maria a more in-depth understanding of how to converse better in Spanish. "Studying abroad in Salamanca, Spain, absolutely exceeded my expectations. Language-wise, I actually learned way more Spanish than I thought I would." Studying abroad has helped Maria gain the confidence needed to converse in Spanish, thus helping her with her future teaching career.



Yamelli Hernandez

Yamelli Hernandez, Communications major, also studied abroad on the University of Salamanca program. Studying abroad helped Yamelli come out of her introverted shell. Studying abroad helped her talk to a lot of different people. "At first, I was really nervous about living with my host family and interacting with my host mom's kids. My thoughts about it were nerve-racking at first. Still, once I got there, I became happy with the relationship I was cultivating with my host family. And being in a whole different country, I was more inclined to talk to different people and converse with my professors





I made friends with locals, long-term bonds that, to this day, I still communicate with them. Studying abroad was a fruitful experience. I could grow in ways that I didn't think would grow" For example, Yamelli became more patient and outgoing. "Growing up in America, I was used to fast-paced everything, but in Spain, I learned to appreciate things now, and I would love to go back like right now." Yamelli's family is from the Dominican Republic, and Spanish was her first language.

Growing up always spoke Spanish in her household. The difficulties for Yamelli came from never speaking Spanish in a professional setting. "Studying abroad sharpened my Spanish communication skills. I learned valuable skills as a communication major, especially diversifying my networking skills." Yamelli appreciated spending time with her host mom. "I enjoyed cooking with my host mom. Our dinners would last hours." Yamelli fell in love with the farm-to-table food culture found in Salamanca. "My host mom's best friend was a farmer, and all our eggs, meat, and produce were fresh from local farms."







Her host mom was big into gardening, so Yamelli would help with gardening in her spare time. "I love helping my host mom cook and even helping her in the garden." Yamelli loved the rural location of her host family home. "There was a trail with blueberry bushes, along different plants, and there would be a herd of sheep at the end of the trail." Yamelli would like all students to study abroad, "I was able to grow in ways that I didn't think I would grow in. For example, I became more patient because everything was slow-paced, and I was used to everything going quickly. Also, I learned to be open-minded because I was faced with new experiences."

Maria visited the famous Museum of Prado several times on her own, and Yamelli visited the Museum of Sophia several times as well on her own. "We gained much independence; we were OK with walking the city of Salamanca alone." Both Yamelli and Maria would spend their days off traveling to different countries neighboring Spain. "Everything was so cheap, quick, and so close that it wasn't tiring to travel to various countries." Their favorite and most missed Spanish tradition are siestas, where it is common for locals to take short naps after meals or in the afternoon.

"Unlike America, where things are fast-paced, and on the constant go, we enjoyed the calm feeling that came from the siesta. Everything is just slower-paced. Professors would nonchalantly walk in a tad bit late for class; this allowed us to spend quality time with classmates, unlike in America, where everyone is in a rush." Yamelli and Maria both were astonished by the relaxed culture of Spain. "Most of our professors were super nonchalant." In the beginning, they panicked, thinking all of this would be too difficult. Their professors would tell them after every test. "Just calm down, don't worry." "(Our) Professors were reassuring, which was nice and helpful. Everybody was very calm, and I don't think we ever encountered conflict."












Winter and Spring 2023
