Join the Fulda International Autumn School 2021 on Global Inequalities and Human Rights

Online Event: November 15 - 19, 2021

Free and open to the public!

Three SUNY Cortland faculty will present at the Fulda International Autumn School the week of November 15-19 on Global Inequalities and Human Rights. Dr. Mecke Nagel (Philosophy) will give a keynote lecture on "Contentious Issues in Feminism: Transnational Feminist Debates in Conversation," Dr. Seth Asumah (Political Science and Africana Studies) will lead a panel on "Gender and Globalization," and Dr. Alex Balas (Clark Center and International Studies) will present on "Inequalities within the EU and Integration Challenges." A full schedule of sessions with scholars from around the world is available on the <u>Fulda International School website</u>.

This event is part of the Transnational Governance and Human Rights project, a collaboration between the Department of Social and Cultural Sciences at Fulda University of Applied Sciences and six partner universities, including SUNY Cortland, MacEwan University (Canada), German Jordanian University (Jordan), Birzeit University (Palestine), Sciences Po Toulouse (France), and the University College London (UK). RECENT EVENTS

American University in Cairo reps. visit SUNY Cortland campus

November 9, 2021

On Tuesday, November 9, representatives from the American University in Cairo (AUC) visited our campus. SUNY Cortland has maintained a study abroad partnership with the university for approximately 20 years, but the last ten years have seen a pause in Cortland students traveling to Cairo for study. This pause began with the events of the Arab Spring in January 2011, when we evacuated five students who had just begun their semester study. The safety and security of the city of Cairo has improved significantly since then, and classes have move to the New Cairo campus, so efforts have been made to reinvigorate this partnership with SUNY Cortland.

Visiting from the New York City offices of the American University in Cairo were Shafika Khayatt, Assoc. Vice President of International Engagement, and Sarah Shalash, International Engagement advisor. These two visitors met with President Bitterbaum to discuss the partnership, and talked with faculty, staff, and students to explore opportunities both in Cairo and at SUNY Cortland. We are fortunate to have a student from AUC studying at SUNY Cortland this semester, Salma Abouradwan, who was featured in the Student Spotlight of the November 2 edition of the IPO Newsletter. Salma met with the staff from AUC as well as with students who are preparing to study at the American University in Cairo for the spring 2022 semester. Next semester it is expected that two students from AUC will visit SUNY Cortland as exchange students, so be on the lookout for them in your classes so you can help to welcome them to the campus community. Who knows: after you meet them you might be the next student to travel to Cairo?

INTERNATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR GRADUATING STUDENTS

Are you looking to have a significant experience abroad after you graduate? Many students have missed out on the opportunity to study abroad because of the COVID-19 pandemic, but your dreams of traveling and making a positive impact can live on in a number of different ways. Many of these opportunities can be found on the <u>Beyond Cortland</u> page of the International Programs website.

Teach Abroad

There are paid positions for native English speakers to teach English in a number of countries. Programs such as the JET Program (Japan), NALCAP (Spain), TAPIF (France), Fulbright (multiple countries), and Aclipse (China and South Korea) offer positions where college graduates can team teach with a fulltime teacher, or teach on their own. While a degree in Education can help applicants, it is not required for many positions. Hugh Anderson, Senior Study Abroad Advisor, taught in Japan through the JET Program and highly recommends teaching abroad for the chance to share your culture and see the world. With an education degree and teacher certification, you can also pursue an international teaching career at international schools (Pre-K to 12) around the world. Graduate School Abroad

Some of the benefits of pursing a graduate degree abroad can be the chance to live abroad for an extended period of time, and many graduate programs in other countries are considerably less expensive than in the U.S. Cost of living may be higher than in the U.S., so you want to consider your options before you apply. If you are interested in graduate school abroad, we recommend checking out <u>GoOverseas' Graduate Resource Page</u> to search for and read reviews of graduate programs abroad.

Volunteer with the Peace Corps

Take part in programs around the world aimed at developing infrastructure and human rights. Projects exist in areas of agriculture, community economic development, education, environment, health, and youth development. Peace Corps volunteers are placed in over 60 different countries and serve for an average duration of 10 months, with a minimum placement of 3 months.

Become a Foreign Service Officer

Work at a U.S. embassy or U.S. consulate abroad, promoting U.S. interests and supporting U.S. citizens. Worldwide availability is a requirement, meaning that you do not have ultimate choice in where you would be posted. If you are adventurous and want to be in a position where you can make a difference in the lives of others, this might be the work for you.

U.S. Department of State Internships and Short-Term Assignments

By applying online through USAJOBS.GOV, you can find a position in Washington D.C. or abroad. Internships can lead to contract work or short-term assignments in which participants promote U.S. interests and higher education.
