

# Transfer Planning Sheet (SUNY Broome) Tourism and Recreation (TORC), B.S.

SUNY Cortland recommends students complete the following courses prior to transfer. The transfer credit limit from a 2-year college is 64 credits. All classes are three (3) credits unless otherwise noted. General education categories in bold lettering are required for this major. In addition, **take 3 courses**: 2 courses from separate general education categories not yet taken, and 1 course in any general education category. (30 credits minimum of GE coursework)

## Applying to Cortland

- SUNY Cortland accepts the Common Application and the SUNY Online <u>application</u>. Choose just one way to apply; both require a \$50 non-refundable application fee.
- ➤ If you apply to Cortland using the SUNY application, SUNY will waive the \$50 application fee for transfer students graduating with an associate degree from a SUNY or CUNY college, who apply directly to Cortland for baccalaureate programs.
- Fall applicants should apply by March 1. Spring applications should apply by November 1.
- After applying, students must send transcripts from all colleges attended and a high school transcript.
