Materials: Large newsprint and markers

- 1. Come up with list of groups that we have stereotypes about (African-American, gays/lesbians, disabled people, athletes, women, etc). You can tailor this to the class.
- 2. Divide the class into small groups and give each group one of the above categories.
- 3. On big paper, let the groups generate all the stereotypes they can think of for that group (encourage them to be honest, say what they hear about these groups). Then discuss (and list) the source of that stereotype, how it's reinforced, and the effect it has. See below:
