Information for Prospective Students

Over the last five years SUNY Cortland has established strong and vibrant relationships with two universities in Turkey: Anadolu University and Izmir University of Economics. The result of this work has been the creation of three dual-diploma programs; each program allows a university student to begin his/her program in Turkey, and then continue his/her academic progress at SUNY Cortland. At the end of the program the student has spent two years in classes in Turkey and two years in classes in the United States. That student will then graduate with degrees from both institutions.

Admission to the DDP.

The first step in the admission process is based on the placement score (Y-ÖSS) from the national university entrance exam (ÖSS), which is held annually in June. The placement score is a combination of the student's high school GPA and exam score in the relevant subject category. Students are placed into these programs by the national Student Selection and Placement Center (ÖSYM). For more details see
