FACULTY SENATE MINUTES #10

March 3, 2015

The tenth meeting of the Faculty Senate 2014-2015 was called to order by Chair Kathy Lawrence on Tuesday, March 3, 2015 at 1:15 PM in the Park Center Hall of Fame Room.

- 3. Duties:
- d. Long-Range Planning Committee:
 - To consider and recommend to the Senate matters related to current academic plans, long-range planning, and other such matters designated to it by the Senate.
 - To determine the procedure whereby faculty and student input is obtained regarding long-range plans. The procedure developed shall be subject to approval by the Senate, and to mandatory review every-twoyears.
 - 3. Procedures to be Used by the LRPC a. Ask all academic units and departments to either (i) prioritize and submit to the LRPC aspects of their academic unit long-range or strategic plans or statements, or (ii) if no formal plan or statements exist, to submit a statement of prioritized strategic values or issues agreed upon by the academic unit. This will be accomplished through a Web-based survey and will be reflective of the new SUNY Cortland Mission Statement. This could include the use of an online forum (e.g., a "wiki") or other methods of input such as open forums and/orsurveys.

b. LRPC will present its findings and recommendations to the Faculty-Senate, the Strategic Planning Steering Committee and the campus-community in the spring of 2009.

- d. Planning Committee:
 - To consider and recommend to the Senate matters related to current academic plans, planning, and other such matters designated to it by the Senate, the Steering Committee of the Senate, or the Chair of the Senate on behalf of the faculty.
 - To determine the procedure whereby faculty and student input is obtained regarding the review and assessment of strategic plans and indicators of institutional effectiveness. The procedure developed shall be subject to approval by the Senate, and to mandatory review every three years.
 - 3. To provide the Senate with a summary of input from faculty and students regarding strategic plans.
 - 4. To assist with the alignment of program, department, school, and unit plans with the college strategic plan.
 - 5. To serve as an advocate for planning across campus.
 - 6. To serve as a liaison between the administration and the Senate concerning all planning that may affect the campus community.


