- OARA: Self-nominations and nominations from other SUNY Cortland faculty and professional staff will be accepted. The names and departments of nominees should be sent to Amy Henderson-Harr, Research and Sponsored Programs Office, 402 Miller on or before February 5, 2016. RSPO will notify nominees of their recommendation by February 7, 2016. Nominee packet of materials due to RSPO by February 19, 2016. The College Research Committee will evaluate nomination packet materials and make a recommendation(s) to the Provost by March 4, 2016.
 - OARA review meeting to occur in February will be set prior to Thanksgiving.
 - o CRC will meet prior to the end of February to review FRP proposals

The CRC Chair indicated she has received a number of inquiries about the FRP which may indicate an increase in proposals.

The CRC agreed to craft an appeal for increased funding for FRP.
