XI. Announcements:

- A. Blavos: There is concern regarding current faculty search; HR wants to wait to conduct reference checks after candidates have completed on campus interviews
- A. Blavos: Issues with registration for certain courses (PE. Health, GE's); since there aren't any seats available in certain courses, students are unable to have a full-time schedule....this creates a serious concern for the dis-service it does to these students
 - A. McClellan working with deans discussing the possibility of hiring adjuncts to make more sections available to students
- R. Bryan: Commented that such issues as A. Blavos raised has taken its toll on the PE Department; in addition to the department's advising issues, these registration concerns are eroding what was once considered a premiere program for the university....PE Department is under a tremendous amount of distress
 - K. Lawrence suggested that if any colleagues have any ideas to assist the PE Department, and/or any suggestions to assist with advising issues across various departments, to please send them to her at: <u>lawrencek@cortland.edu</u>
 - A. McClellan reported that the Provost's Office is working with the PE Department to try and devise a solution to help alleviate some of the issues the department is facing
 - R. Borden: Hire professional academic advisors who focus solely on advising?
 - A. McClellan: It is being discussed to hire 1-2 advisors for the office of Advisement and Transition
- L. Jin: Announced professional development opportunity; webinar to be held online on 11/9/23 from 12:30PM-2:30PM. Webinar will focus on assessment technology and A.I.
