**<u>I. Approval of Minutes:</u>** The Minutes, as amended, from January 30<sup>th</sup> were approved by the Senate; amendments were as follows:

- Under the Chair's report, "projected timeline for ROG the date of 4/12/24 Present at the Faculty Senate open meeting", was changed to the correct date of 4/16/24
- Under the President's report, "received \$3 million teaching grant from SUNY Systems..." was changed to reflect that the grant received was to be allocated among all SUNY institutions, rather than SUNY Cortland receiving the grant in its entirety from SUNY Systems

### II. Chair's Report: K. Lawrence:

- On behalf of L. Lopez-Janove, reported that the issues with the campus climate surveys are being looked into and will hopefully be resolved within the next few days
- New Chair of the CTE Committee, E. Faulkenbury, is working with the committee on a resolve to combat, as well as redact, discriminatory remarks on Course Teacher Evaluations
  - E. Faulkenbury and another member of the CTE committee are meeting with L. Lopez Janove and the Faculty Senate Steering Committee to present the committee's ideas for a possible solution to this situation of biased comments on the CTEs.
- Working to establish ad-hoc committee to address contingent faculty rights; recognized R. Borden for diligence in research and advocacy regarding contingent faculty rights
- Announced that the Fall 2024 Call for Nominations is scheduled to go out to campus on 3/19/24

## III. Vice Chair/Secretary's Report: D. Harms:

- Announced nominations that were submitted via email to fill senator and committee vacancies; there were no nominations received (*Please find documents attached*).
  - Remaining vacancies are as follows:
    - Senator vacancies (8 total): 1 seat representing Math/Science, 1 seat representing Social/Behavioral Sciences, 1 seat representing FTL Education OR Professional Studies, 1 seat representing Professional Studies, 2 seats representing Professional Faculty, 1 seat representing Graduate Faculty, and 1 seat representing Part-Time Faculty
    - Committee vacancies (2 total): PFAC: 1 (unexpired term) seat representing Academic Affairs, GE: 1 (unexpired term) seat representing Social/Behavioral Sciences

# V. President's Report: E. Bitterbaum:

- Received over 16,000 student applications
  - There have been errors occurring within FASFA, which has slowed down the application process; hopefully, these errors will be resolved by the end of March
- Reported on recent travels to Cuba
  - He and 25 other SUNY delegates were invited to meet with the President of Cuba, as well as the Foreign Minister of Cuba; Cuban president encouraged SUNY students to travel abroad to Cuba
- NYS budget hearings are currently taking place
  - \$54 million this year to allocate among SUNY institutions
- Renovations across campus are going well; possibility that Van Hoesen may be finished a month early
- Encouraged participation in the campus climate survey that has recently been sent out
- Reminded faculty that only the governor has the capability to issue SUNY closures due to inclement weather
- R. Borden raised concern to President Bitterbaum regarding the possibility of parttime faculty losing their jobs as a result of academic departments' inability to pay part-time faculty
  - A. McClellan spoke to the issue explaining that the deans are working with department chairs to come up with a strategic plan
  - It was also noted that this issue falls under union and contractual concerns
  - R. Bryan announced that on 3/4/24 and 3/5/24 there will be opportunities to advocate to UUP in Albany; if anyone is interested, please feel free to contact R. Bryan
