II. Chair's Report: K. Lawrence:

- Acknowledged P. Schroeder for her continued dedication to the Faculty Senate and thanked her for her willingness to assist when called upon
- Reminded everyone about the upcoming Spring 2025 Call for Nominations that will be officially sent to campus on 3/11/24
 - o Deadline to submit nominations via email will be 3/24/25 by 4PM
 - O Slate of nominations received will be presented to the Faculty Senate as a slate at the 3/25/25 meeting
 - Reminders regarding elections and serving on the Faculty Senate and/or Faculty Senate committees
 - If an individual has been elected to serve on a committee, then that person is not required to attend Faculty Senate; however, Senators are required to attend Faculty Senate meetings on alternating Tuesdays
 - Any officer, or chair of one of the 4 policy committees (AFAC, EPC, JCSI, and PFAC), or SUNY UFS Senator are required to attend both the Steering Committee and Faculty Senate meetings on Tuesdays
 - Newly elected senators/officers/committee members terms begin after the final day of Final Exams week; newly elected Chair of the Faculty Senate term begins following Commencement

V. President's Report: E. Bitterbaum:

- Followed up regarding concern over procedure if ICE or external law enforcement were to come to campus
 - o There are 2 documents that will be available behind a firewall in MyRedDragon
 - o An email will also be sent to the campus
- Dear Colleague Letter: there will be no changes to our website and/or titles across campus

- Commented that several universities are experiencing hardships (i.e. Cornell hiring freeze, MIT and Harvard are not accepting new students at the moment); all things considered, our campus is not in that bad of shape
- Thanked M. Yacavone for his presentation last week
- Recent fundraising trip a success; pledges totaling \$115,000 in one week
 - o A. Blavos asked about the trend from donors to the campus
 - E. Bitterbaum explained that many of the donors are former students who were here in the 40s, 50s, and/or 60s and scholarship money was what allowed them to attend college; also, donors tend to be more liable to give money to a school like Cortland, where their funds will go further than a larger university (Cornell is around \$88,000/year, Miami University is around \$90,000/year whereas Cortland is around \$\$24,000/year)
- Announced that the Reverend Pauly Murray's niece will be on campus this evening giving a presentation in Jacobus Lounge
