In the fall of 1997, COR 101: The Cortland Experience was initiated at SUNY Cortland. The course was developed from the growing field of research and practice regarding first-year experience and previous initiatives at SUNY Cortland. This one credit course is a requirement for all incoming first-year students with the primary goal of helping them understand, process, and negotiate the transition to college. This includes challenging students to examine their sense of self, locus of control, and purpose in college. Assisting students in acknowledging the value of multiple perspectives as well as learning about campus resources and systems and becoming involved and invested in the Cortland college experience. Instructors are required to have a Bachelor's Degree (Master's Preferred) with at least two years working in a higher education setting. Thank you for your interest in the COR 101 program.
