I really wanted students to leave with a solid understanding of the Title IX office here on campus and how they could get more information themselves if they needed it.


Title IX is not always the most strongly advertised, so I want to give my students a good basis for the information they'd need about the Title IX office so they had a good base if they needed to find more information.


PURPOSE: WHY TITLE IX?
