## Pass/No Credit Grading Option

A P grade may correspond to any standard letter grade above failure (D- or above). Grades of NC indicate failure, and no credit is awarded. Students may pursue pass/no credit grades when it is the sole grading mode for a course, or when a junior or senior undergraduate optionally uses pass/no credit grading for an elective course. Standard grade equivalents are not retained or provided for pass/no credit grades. NOTE: Some courses were eligible for pass/no credit grading during the COVID-19 pandemic. These courses have been identified with the notation "Elected P/NC due to COVID-19".
