## Administrative Update

- Sabbatical leaves have been approved by Provost

- Faculty, staff, and student survey information was released today; plans for an open meeting are in process
- Search updates
  - Two approved faculty searches are moving forward, one in AAS and one in Childhood Education
  - PRODIG will be the only additional search this academic year; Deans will meet to identify how to fill vacancies
  - o Bruce identified 18 vacant lines with five departments with multiple lines to fill
  - Arts and Sciences will get 2-3 or maybe 4 lines from PRODiG

Virtual conference fees – revised procedure

  - Does sharing the number over the phone violate the PCard rules?
  - Sometimes there is an ethics statement faculty need to acknowledge during registration

#### **New Business**

Spring 2021 low enrolled courses

- Process to identify low enrollment courses
  - Report was run to exclude courses with caps below 4

- Bruce sorted spreadsheet on instructor name and class meeting time to account for cross-listing
- o Did not account for max capacity
- o Some courses have a low cap and will be full and on this list
- Bruce will have a conversation with chairs before sending list to Provost
  - The intention of the spreadsheet is to summarize information the context is important
  - o Cross-listed courses are associated with department of instructor
  - o Consider all sections offered for a course
  - Late in the day courses are not filling
  - Students are still adjusting their schedules
  - Bruce will send out raw data

## Spring 2021 calendar: pacing/study days

- Petition from the students and faculty requesting pacing days is circulating
- What is the impact of a pacing day during the week?
- According to faculty survey 70% were not in favor of pacing days
