

Exit Survey: Findings Fall 2022, Spring 2023, Fall 2023, and Spring 2024

The Exit Survey is intended to elicit completers' insights as to the quality of their teacher preparation and ways they were prepared for the profession. Completers are asked to rate their preparation in content mastery, instructional theory, reflection, respect for diversity, the integration of technology, the use of educational research to inform instruction, assessment, developmentally appropriate instruction, classroom management, parental engagement, differentiation of instruction, and data-driven instructional decision-making. The Survey includes seven program satisfaction questions and 24 core questions about teacher preparation aligned to the InTASC standards. The survey also includes open ended questions asking for additional comments on program satisfaction and quality of candidates' teacher preparation program. The Survey uses a scale of strongly agree, agree, disagree, and strongly disagree.

The response rate for all iterations of this survey from each of the semesters noted below is 100% as this is a required completer survey.
